Summary

The resource staff are responsible for designing and delivering specialized curriculum for our resident and day campers. Resource staff also assist in programming, operations, cabins, and any other areas of camp that require additional support. The waterfront instructors are responsible for ensuring that all resident and day campers are adequately supervised during all aquatic activities such as general swim and waterfront rotations.

Responsibilities and Duties

- Working with leadership team to develop intentional curriculum for your resource area.
- Managing inventory and supplies of swim shack, as well as PFD's at swim docks and cabin 2 clearing.
- Maintaining inflatable water toys, assisting with set up, tear down, and maintenance
- Forming meaningful connections with all campers and adapting program plans to suit specific needs of a group.
- Assisting Wilderness Director with pack out and managing depot inventory.
- Assisting counsellors with campers who require additional support and/or supervision.
- Assisting with outreach to both potential campers and staff during off season.

Knowledge Skills and Abilities

- Strong interpersonal skills with the ability to work with children in building self-esteem and self-confidence.
- Ingenuity and inventiveness, capable of thinking on one's feet and adapting to changes in scheduling.
- A disciplined, results-oriented, self-starter, demonstrating initiative and the ability to work independently with minimal supervision, while also being able to manage multiple responsibilities.
- Excellent decision making under pressure. Safety and risk management oriented thinking,

- Minimum 2 years childcare experience with preference given to those with residential summer camp experience
- Experience lifeguarding at city pools (open water lifeguarding experience an asset)
- Current CPR C and Standard First Aid
- Current NLS

Physical Aspects of the Position

Reasonable Accommodations may be made to individuals with disabilities to perform essential job functions.

- Work Environment: Work is performed both indoors and outdoors in all weather.
- Strength Requirements: Ability to lift and carry up to 30 pounds.
- Visual and Hearing Requirements: Volume level can range from quiet to moderately loud.
- Sufficient eye-hand coordination to operate equipment as needed.
- Communication: Ability to verbally communicate to exchange information with both English-speaking and non English-speaking contacts.

 - Can climb stairs and walk on high grade and rustic terrain.
 - Lead camp activities such as hiking (up to 90 minutes), swimming (from a beach or dock), and building campfires (squatting up to 30 minutes)
